

## Plato's *Symposium* Helpful Notes

182c3 - 183b5

φιλέω used personally and impersonally with complementary infinitive “be wont.” Here subject is ὁ ἕρως.

ἐτέθη and θεμένων from τίθημι

τούτων genitive of comparison with κάλλιον

ἐνθυμηθέντι 1st aorist passive (deponent) participle, dative singular masculine, from ἐνθυμέομαι “consider well, think about”

τοῦ λάθρα [ἐρᾶν] another genitive of comparison (woot! woot!)

κἄν...ῶσι what kind of clause?

αἰσχύους (= αἰσχύονες; see Smyth 293; works like βελτίων) from αἰσχύρος

τολμῶη 3rd person singular present optative active of τολμάω

καρποῖτ' = καρποῖτο from καρπόω active “bear fruit” middle “reap fruit, enjoy”

ὄνειδῃ What case and number?

τὰ παιδικά How many words for the beloved have we seen so far?

ὀμνύντες present active participle, masculine nominative plural of ὀμνυμι / ὀμνύω; see Smyth 418 for the -νῦμι verbs.

δέδοται perfect active indicative, third person singular, of δίδωμι
