φιλέω used personally and impersonally with complementary infinitive "be wont." Here subject is δ ἔρως.

ἐτέθη and θεμένων from τίθημι

τούτων genitive of comparison with κάλλιον

ένθυμηθέντι 1st aorist passive (deponent) participle, dative singular masculine, from ένθυμέομαι "consider well, think about"

τοῦ λάθρα [ἐρᾶν] another genitive of comparison (woot! woot!)

κἂν...ὦσι what kind of clause?

αἰσχίους (= αἰσχίονες; see Smyth 293; works like βελτίων) from αἰσχρός

τολμώη 3rd person singular present optative active of τολμάω

καρποῖτ' = καρποῖτο from καρπόω active "bear fruit" middle "reap fruit, enjoy"

ὀνείδη What case and number?

τὰ παιδικά How many words for the beloved have we seen so far?

όμνύντες present active participle, masculine nominative plural of ὄμνυμι / ὀμνύω; see Smyth 418 for the -ν $\bar{\nu}$ μι verbs.

δέδοται perfect active indicative, third person singular, of δίδωμι
